Activities

GROWTH CHART


Materials:

- Growth chart template
- Vegetable and fruit images
- Scissors
- Glue

Method:

1. Chart can be handed out as a take home worksheet. m
2. Children can colour in the vegetables and fruits they are going to plant, cut these out and stick them around their chart.
3. Children can draw the fruit and vegetables onto their chart.
4. To use the chart:
 - a. Use different colour textas/pencils to show the growth of the item via the squares in the chart.
 - b. Draw what the growing plant looks like, using a different square for each day.

PEAS IN A POD

Materials:

- Green paper
- Green felt
- White cardboard
- Scissors
- Glue
- Black texta

Method:

1. Place 2 pieces of green paper on top of each other. Draw a pea-pod shape on the top piece of paper. Cut this shape from both pages.
2. Trace a cup or other circular object onto the felt to make the peas. Cut these out.
3. Glue 1 of the pea pods onto white cardboard.
4. Put glue on the round bottom of the second pea pod and stick this onto the first pea pod. Ensure the glue is only placed on the bottom of the second pod; we want the pod to have an opening.
5. Draw smiley faces onto the peas.
6. Place the peas inside their pod.
7. Leave the peas unglued so they can be played with.
